



Headed to Taiwan for a visit to a colleague and friend; again, SFO! Top left: an ANA B77W, an Air Canada B789, my United B77W that would take me to TPE, and a United B77W pushing back. On takeoff, a fantastic variety of jets (2xB772 United, 3xB789 United, 1xB788 United, 1xB752 United, and 1xB77W Philippine Airlines), our shadow while climbing out, the Golden Gate Bridge, and San Francisco's skyline.









I splurged and got a room at the Novotel Taipei Taoyuan Airport Hotel, known for its view's of TPE. I was not disappointed, and they were kind enough to give me a north-facing room toward the airport. Top right clockwise: an Eva Air B788; a China Airlines A359; one Air France B788, one China Airlines A359, one China Airlines B773, one China Airlines A330, one Eva Air A330, and one Eva Air B773 lined up at remote stands; an Eva Air B773; an Eva Air A332 (with two Eva Air A321s in the background); and a China Airlines A333 with an Eva Air A321 in the background. Note, that you can see the construction on TPE's new Terminal 3 in several of the pictures.

Taipei Taoyuan also has a very nice viewing deck on top of Terminal 2, providing some great view without any glass! I ventured into Taipei City to see Taipei 101 (left counter-clockwise). On the subway, I got some bonus views of the ramp of Taipei Songshan airport. From inside the terminal back at Taipei Taoyuan, the Sanrio Character Eva Air A333; the Boeing China Airlines B773; an Air Asia A320; an Eva Air B788; two Tiger Air A320s. Back in the US, my United B753 (SFO-DEN) – my first time on a 753! Finally, on the right, my United B77W from Taoyuan that took me from TPE-SFO. What a great trip!

All good spotters must eat their vegetables to get a feel for the location before the main event, and what tasty veggies! Above: a retro AA "Astrojet" B738, a Delta 712, and a B737-8MAX.

Below: the surprise of the day, Air Force Two arrived with Pence on board, a Boeing C-32A (reg. 98-0001).







The main event! Air Force One arrives (Boeing VC-25A, reg. 82-8000). The police were very gracious to let us spotters watch in peace, the angle was perfect except for the backlighting. Trump passed high to the east over the Port of Catoosa, circled over downtown, and looped around to land. My friend Richard was able to join me.













As I mentioned, both AF2 and AF1 were backlit on landing, so I went down to Fine Airport Parking, paid \$7.50, and took some much better photos from the 4th floor. Note, without the vice president (Pence) and president (Trump) on board, these are no longer AF1 and AF2, they are a Boeing VC-25A and Boeing C-32A.

I spent the night, and the next day drove around to take some pictures of the dozens of AA planes stored at TUL. Below, clockwise from the upper right: a B789 and B788, a B789 and B788 (with tractor), a B737 tail outside of Lufthansa Technik, three of many grounded Boeing 737-8MAX, and four B777. I've wanted to go to Tulsa to see the grounded planes, and with AF1, the decision was set! What a WONDERFUL two days of spotting in Tulsa!
